- ***Courses not on the list:*** Special topics courses, variable topics courses, courses taken on study abroad, and other courses not on this list may be considered for the minor if they meet the established criteria. Please provide a syllabus for review by an International Studies Minor advisor.

Criteria for Core and Elective Courses

Core Area Courses meet the following criteria:

- Core courses must be truly international in scope; they must include a body of knowledge which is being applied to more than one region of the world. A region of the world consists of more than one country, for example: the Middle East, Western Europe, Scandinavia, or Southeast Asia. The major continents of the world consist of multiple regions.
- Core courses must deal with issues deemed highly relevant to modern international phenomena. Modern is deemed to include the period from 1815 to the present.

Elective courses meet the following criteria:

- Electives must deal with modern international phenomena (1815-present).
- Unlike core area courses, electives may focus on a single region or country of the world.
